

THE FEEL OF THE FEST AMIDST COVID-19



Enzian Theater management continues to evaluate safety measures daily, both inside the theater and at Eden Bar, to ensure our guests have a pleasant, worry-free experience, and to maintain a healthy environment for our staff in the process. The Florida Film Festival will be no exception.

If you choose to attend the festival, we want you to feel reassured by our practices in place, and of course, inspired by the movies you'll see. So, what does the COVID-19 version of our in-person festival experience entail? Expect a more relaxed FFF – with no Opening Night Party and no Awards Bash this year, we're focusing our attention entirely on the celebration of independent film and filmmakers. We're also putting safety first, as you'll see below.



Face coverings are required and must be worn when entering and exiting the theater, and when interacting with staff. We are complying with Orange County Government regulations, and **remind you to wear your mask at all times, except when eating and drinking.**

We will be taking guests' temperatures upon entering the theater before each screening. We realize an added step like this can feel like an inconvenience, but **safety is our first priority.** Staff members have their temperatures checked daily upon arrival as well. We are all doing our part to look out for one another, and appreciate your support and understanding. We've enhanced sanitary procedures. Staff fogs the theater with CDC approved chemicals daily, and performs cleaning duties multiple times throughout the

day, specifically before and after each screening. This includes spraying down our fabric chairs, and cleaning tables, hand rails, door plates, restrooms and more.

We're working to reduce your physical interaction with others:

We've physically distanced our seating areas. You may enjoy a movie with your party while remaining socially distanced from other theater guests. Each table is spaced six feet or more apart.

We will be using more than one entrance during the fest, and queue lines for patrons have markers indicating six-foot spacing. We offer a contactless menu at each table. Just scan the QR code with the camera on your phone to view our menu options. Our goal is to achieve as little contact as possible during your visit. Remember – **no mask, no service, so when you're ready to order, make sure your face is covered.**

For the first time ever, FFF is going virtual!

With the current 50% capacity regulation in place, seating is limited, and we realize it may be difficult to snag a ticket to everything you want to see. We also completely understand that some



of you might rather stay home this year, which is why we've done our best to make the Florida Film Festival available to everyone in some capacity. We'll miss having a larger crowd in the theater, but that doesn't mean you have to miss us! For just \$40, anyone can

purchase our FFF Virtual Pass and have access to a majority of the Florida Film Festival from the comfort of their home. The virtual platform will house over 150 FFF titles also screening in-theater.

"We are excited that this new digital platform will allow a good portion of our lineup to be available to independent film lovers across the whole state of Florida, bringing a part of the Florida Film Festival experience into their homes."
